How to Play Roulette

1. Buy-in with your cash chips at the gaming table and you will receive colour chips. These 'colour' chips only have value at this table and must be exchanged for cash chips before you leave the table.
2. Place your chips on the layout according to your preference.
3. The Dealer will help you place your bets if you require assistance, but it is your responsibility to make sure that the bets are placed correctly.
4. Once the Dealer has spun the ball you may place your bets until the Dealer announces that no more bets may be placed.
5. After the ball drops into a number in the wheel, the Dealer announces the number and places a marker, called a dolly, on the corresponding number on the table. This is the winning number.
6. The Dealer clears the table, leaving all the winning bets and then pays them accordingly.

The Wheel

The wheel is divided into 37 equal segments, numbered 0 to 36. These are divided into red and black with the exception of zero which is green.

In addition to the basic bets shown, you may place several specialised bets:

Neighbours - Groups of five numbers together on the wheel, e.g. 2, 25, 17, 34, 6 = '17 and the neighbours', a five-chip bet.

Tier - Covering the twelve numbers on the following splits: 5/8, 10/11, 13/16, 23/24, 27/30, 33/36.

Voisins du Zero - Covering the seventeen numbers on the section of the wheel from 22 to 25. A nine-chip bet: 0/2/3 (x2), 4/7, 12/15, 18/21, 19/22, 25/29 (x2), and 32/35.

Orphelins - Covering the remaining eight numbers not included in Tier or Voisins du Zero. A five-chip bet: 1, 6/9, 14/17, 17/20 and 31/34.

To make these bets, simply give the correct number of chips to the Dealer and announce clearly which bet you have chosen.

These bets will be placed on the "Racetrack" which is located on the layout just in front of the Dealer.

Spread Bet Side Wagers - The aim is to place a wager on the winning total. The total is two numbers added together and shown as such on the Winning number display at the end of each spin.

Place your wager/s on any of the 7 combinations of spread bet areas available. There is no limit to the number of spread bets which can be played in any one game.

Once the Dealer spins the ball, the two wheels on the display will start turning in a counter direction to each other; they will then randomly stop and align.

Once the roulette ball has come to rest the winning number will be confirmed on the Winning Number display, this will be added to the aligned number shown on the 'Bonus Wheel' resulting in the winning spread betting total for that spin.

Place Your Bets

Bets are placed on the layout (shown above) and are paid at varying odds. Each table has a minimum and maximum bet which are displayed above each table.

1. Chip position - 'Single' bet Red, Black, Odd, Even, 1 - 18 or 19 - 36 pays Even money. When zero appears half your bet will be returned.
2. Chip position - 'Single' bet set of twelve numbers pays 2 - 1 (dozen).
3. Chip position - Spread Bet Side Wager.

Chip position - 'Straight up' bet any single number pays 35 - 1.

Chip position - 'Split' bet any two numbers pays 17 - 1.

Chip position - 'Street' bet any three numbers pays 11 - 1.

Chip position - 'Corner' bet any four numbers pays 8 - 1.

Chip position - 'Sixline' bet any six numbers pays 5 - 1.

Chip position - 'Column' bet any twelve numbers pays 2 - 1.

Chip position - 'Dozens' bet any twelve numbers pays 2 - 1.

House Edge

In Roulette, the House Edge is achieved by the casino paying slightly less than the true odds. The true odds for a single Roulette number to win are 36 - 1, since there are 37 numbers in the wheel. Winning bets, however, are actually paid at 35 - 1.

If the winning number is Zero, Even Chance bets retain half the stake. Even Chance bet 1.35%.

Bets on the layout 2.70%.

How to Play Blackjack

Aim of the Game

In Blackjack, you play against the Dealer. To win your total must be greater than the Dealer's total, but not exceed 21. Your hand will lose if your card total is less than the Dealer's or greater than 21. If your total is the same as the Dealer's then the result is a tie, or 'stand off'.

Card Values

Cards from 2 to 10 have their face value. Jacks, Queens, and Kings have a value of ten. Aces count as one or eleven.

Blackjack

A Blackjack is when the first two cards dealt to you are an Ace and a card with the value of ten. A Blackjack is paid at odds of 3 - 2.

How to Play

Each Player places a bet in the betting areas marked on the layout.

All Players receive two cards and the Dealer one. The Players are asked in turn whether they wish to 'draw' another card or 'stay' with the total they have. No further cards can be taken on 21, even where an Ace could represent 1:

e.g. 6 + 4 + Ace must represent 21 and not 11.

Once all Players have made their decisions, the Dealer draws cards to their hand. The Dealer must draw a card to their hand if he/she has 16 or less. When the Dealer's hand reaches a total of 17 or more he/she must not draw another card. All winning bets are paid even money with the exception of any Blackjacks.

Splitting

When the first two cards dealt to your hand are a pair you may split them to create two separate hands, by placing an additional stake equal to the original bet. Split Aces will only receive one additional card (unless a further Ace is received when you may split again). If the subsequent card dealt has a value of ten this will only count as 21 and not a Blackjack.

Doubling

A Player may double any two cards total by placing an additional stake equal to the original bet. The Player will only receive one additional card to this hand.

Insurance

If the Dealer has an Ace:

- And the player has a Blackjack, the Dealer should offer even money to the player. The player can accept the even money at this point or continue the hand.
- If the player is dealt any other hand, the player may place an insurance wager of half their original stake which will be paid at 2:1 in the event the Dealer gets a Blackjack.

21+3

21+3 is an optional bonus bet that introduces an element of Poker into Blackjack. It combines your first two cards with the Dealer's first card, to make a Three Card Poker hand. Paid 9 - 1.

At the same time as you place your standard Blackjack bet, place your 21+3 wager in the betting area provided. If your first two cards



combine with the Dealer's first card to make any of the following Poker hands, your wager will be paid at 9 - 1.

Flush - Three unrelated cards of the same suit

Straight - Three consecutive cards of differing suits

Three of a Kind - Three cards of the same denomination e.g. three sevens

Straight Flush - Three consecutive cards of the same suit

If your cards do not make one of these Poker hands, your 21+3 wager will lose but your Blackjack wager remains unaffected. Play will continue once all 21+3 side bets have been settled.

21+3 TOP 3

TOP 3 is a proprietary side wager of 21+3 and can only be played if a 21+3 bet is made.

Perfect Pairs

Perfect pair is a feature on Blackjack giving you the option to place an extra bet that your first two cards will be a pair.

How to Play

Simply place a bet in addition to your original Blackjack bet on the area of the table marked for Perfect Pairs bets.

Perfect Pairs 30 - 1

Two cards that are exactly alike including colour and suit.



Coloured Pair (6 decks) 10 - 1

Two cards that are exactly alike (including colour) except for the suit.



Mixed Pair 5 - 1

Two cards that are exactly alike except for suit and colour.



House Edge

In the standard Blackjack game, the edge can vary (for and against the house) according to player style. Wynn Mayfair uses 6 decks on all Blackjack tables.

6 decks (best techniques)	0.45%

Progressive Jackpot

The progressive jackpot is a side bet on Blackjack. To play the progressive jackpot the player must have a valid bet on the blackjack box.

The cost to play the progressive jackpot is £25/£50 which must be placed on the sensor in front of the box where the player has a valid bet. Progressive bets cannot be placed or removed once the dealer has announced 'no more bets'.

Every progressive jackpot starts with a seed amount funded by the operator. A portion of each qualifying bet adds to the jackpot, making it grow until won. For each progressive jackpot, 27% of each qualifying stake is contributed to the jackpot pool. If a jackpot is removed or replaced, any remaining funds will be redistributed to another game or paid out fairly, in line with UK Gambling Commission rules.



How to Play Baccarat

The aim of the game is to place a wager on the hand you believe will receive the higher total. You may also bet that both hands have the same total, or tie.

Once all bets are placed, four cards are dealt out of the shoe in the following sequence Player, Bank, Player, Bank creating a Player hand and a Bank hand.

Two additional cards may be drawn by the Dealer, according to the Table of Play. After all cards have been dealt (maximum of 6) the Dealer will call the winning hand.

Hand Totals

The highest hand total in Baccarat is 9 and the lowest is 0. Cards from Ace to 9 have their face value, Tens, Jacks, Queens, and Kings count as 0.

When determining the value of a hand only the right-hand digit is used. For example:

2 + 3 + 6 = 11 the hand value is 1.

6 + 4 = 10 the hand value is 0 (Baccarat).

King + 7 = 17 the hand value is 7.

Table of Play

There are no optional draws. Both Player and Bank must draw according to the following Tables of Play, which apply after the first four cards are dealt. A natural (8 - 9) on either the Player, Bank, or both stops play, with no further cards drawn.

Tie Wager

This is an optional wager, which may be played in addition to or instead of the standard game of Baccarat or Baccarat 2000. This wager will win if the Player cards and the Bank cards' final result is the same, i.e. the hand is a tie. All winning wagers on Tie will be paid and all bets on Player or Bank will remain for the next hand.

Baccarat Pairs Side Wager

An optional side wager, which may be played in addition to or instead of the standard game of Baccarat or Baccarat 2000. This side wager will win if the first two cards dealt to the Player hand or the Bank hand (as nominated by the Player) constitutes a pair (Q+Q, K+K, 2+2, etc). The Player may place a bet on the "Player Baccarat Pairs" or the "Bank Baccarat Pairs" side wager or both.

How to Play Baccarat 2000 (Non-Commission)

The principle of the game is the same as Baccarat, it is played on the same layout and has the same card drawing rules (Table of Play). Winning Player or Bank hands are paid out even money, except when the Bank hand wins with a hand totaling 6; the bet will then be paid half of its stake.

All the above percentage figures are the average expectations but can vary due to the customer's style of play.

Ur Way Egalite

This is an optional wager which may be played in addition to the standard game of Baccarat or Baccarat 2000. A wager must be placed on the Bank or Player in order to have this bet.

The wager is that when the Player card and the Bank card result in an equal specific score, the hand is Egalite. The wager wins if the specific individual Egalite has been wagered on.

All other Ur Way Egalite wagers not connected with the winning individual Egalite lose. If the result is not an Egalite, all wagers on Ur Way Egalite will lose. All winning wagers on Egalite will be paid and all bets on Player or Bank will remain for the next hand.

An optional wager whereby the Bank hand has 3 points with only two cards, and the Player's hand is entitled to receive another card, that card being the third card to the Player's hand will win if it is an 8.

Ranking of Hands

The ranking of hands in Three Card Poker is different from traditional Poker. In Three Card Poker a Straight beats a Flush and a Three of a Kind beats a Straight. If a hand does not contain a Pair or higher, the hand that contains the highest-ranking card(s) wins. Ace is high except in a 3 - 2 Ace sequence. Cards are ranked from highest to lowest as shown overleaf.

How to Play Three Card Poker

Three Card Poker is a version of Poker using a single deck of 52 cards that gives you three different ways to play. The object of the game is to get a Three Card Poker hand with a value higher than the Dealer's hand. At the start of the game before any cards are dealt, decide whether to place a bet on Ante and/or on Pair Plus. After you have placed your initial bet(s), the Dealer will deal three cards face-down to each Player and to themselves. After all the cards have been dealt, pick up your cards and view them.

If you have placed an Ante bet and you believe your hand is high enough to beat the Dealer's hand, then you can continue to play by placing an additional bet on Play that is equal to your original Ante bet.

If you believe your hand will not beat the Dealer's, you can opt to fold and your Ante and/or Pair Plus bets will be collected by the Dealer.

Once all Players have placed a Play bet or folded, the Dealer will turn their cards face up. To qualify, the Dealer must have a hand of at least Queen high. If the Dealer does not qualify with a Queen high, then all Ante, Ante bonus and winning Pair Plus bets are paid.

If the Dealer qualifies and your hand beats the Dealer's, then your Ante and Play bets are paid at even money. The Dealer will then pay any Ante Bonus and Pair Plus bets at the odds listed on the table. Should the Dealer's hand beat your hand, the Dealer will collect both your Ante bet and Play bet. However, Ante bonus and Pair Plus bets will be paid at the odds listed on the table.

Ante Bonus

Ante Bonus bets are paid on all Straights or better; regardless of the result of the Dealer's hand. When your hand qualifies for an Ante Bonus you will win the bonus payout appropriate to that hand (see Pay Table).

Pair Plus

A Pair Plus bet will win when your hand has at least a Pair, regardless of the Dealer's hand (see pay table).

Multi Wager Option

A Player may place a wager on more than one betting area providing that no other Player is excluded from participating in the game. All additional hands are played 'blind' as the Player is only permitted to view their initial hand.

Prime Bets

The Prime Bet is a side bet played on Three Card Poker. The Prime Bet is not played against the Dealer. The customer may only play on their own prime bet. The customer must bet Ante or Pair Plus or both to play the prime bet. The Prime bet must be placed before any cards are dealt. When the customer has any 3 cards of the same colour, the prime bet is paid 3 - 1.

When the customer has any 3 Cards of the same colour, and the Dealer has any 3 cards of the same colour as the customer, the prime bet is paid 4 - 1. All 6 cards must be the same colour for this. The Prime bet will be paid last in sequence, after the Pair Plus.

TCP 21

TCP 21 is an optional bet that the player's cards add up to 21. Court cards count as 10. Aces can count as 1 or 11.

Progressive Jackpot

The progressive Jackpot is a side bet on Three Card Poker. To play the progressive Jackpot the player must have a valid Ante, Prime, or Pair Plus Bet.

The cost to play the progressive Jackpot is £25/£50/£100 which must be placed on the sensor in front of the box where the player has a valid bet. Progressive bets cannot be placed or removed once the dealer has announced 'no more bets'.

How to Play Heads Up Hold'em

Aim of the game

Heads Up Hold'em is a house-banked Poker game played against the Dealer using a standard 52-card deck.

The aim of the game is to make a **higher-ranking five-card Poker hand than the Dealer**, using your two pocket cards and the five community cards.

Optional bonus wagers are available and are **not dependent on the result of the main game**.

Card Values & Hand Rankings

Cards rank from **Two (low) to Ace (high)**.

Poker hands are ranked using standard Texas Hold'em rankings:

Royal Flush
Straight Flush
Four of a Kind
Full House
Flush
Straight
Three of a Kind
Two Pair
One Pair
High Card

Players may use **both, one, or none** of their pocket cards to form their final five-card hand.

How to Play

1. To begin each round, Players must place **equal Ante and Odds wagers**. Optional wagers include **Trips Plus, Pocket Bonus**, and the **Progressive Jackpot**, where available.

2. Each Player and the Dealer are dealt **two cards face down** (pocket cards).

3. The Dealer then deals **five community cards face down** in the centre of the table.

Betting Rounds

Pre-Flop

Players must either:

- **Raise** – place a wager equal to **3 × Ante**, or
- **Check**

Flop

The Dealer reveals the first three community cards. Players who have not raised must now:

- **Raise** – **2 × Ante**, or
- **Check**

Turn & River

The Dealer reveals the final two community cards. Players who have not yet raised must now:

- **Raise** – **1 × Ante**, or
- **Fold**, losing their **Ante and Odds** wagers.

Dealer Qualification

The Dealer qualifies with a **Pair or better**.

Settlements

After all betting is complete, the Dealer reveals their cards and compares hands.

Player Wins

- **Raise** pays **1 to 1** if the Dealer does not qualify
- **Ante** pays **1 to 1** if the Dealer qualifies; **pushes** if the Dealer does not
- **Odds** pay according to the **Winning Odds Pay Table**

Dealer Wins

- **Raise** loses
- **Ante** loses if the Dealer qualifies; **pushes** if the Dealer does not
- Odds pay according to the **Bad Beat Pay Table**

Tie

- **Ante, Raise, and Odds** wagers are **pushed**

Optional Bonus Wagers

All bonus wagers must be played in addition to the main game.

Trips Plus

Paid on the Player's **best five-card hand**:

- Royal Flush – 100 to 1
- Straight Flush – 40 to 1
- Four of a Kind – 30 to 1
- Full House – 8 to 1
- Flush – 7 to 1
- Straight – 4 to 1
- Three of a Kind – 3 to 1

Pocket Bonus

Paid if the Player's **two pocket cards** are:

- Any **Pair**, or
- **Ace-Face** (Ace with King, Queen or Jack)

Progressive Jackpot

Where available, the Progressive Jackpot wager may be played with a valid Ante and Odds bet and is subject to displayed rules and conditions.

Every progressive jackpot starts with a seed amount funded by the operator. A portion of each qualifying bet adds to the jackpot, making it grow until won. For each progressive jackpot, 27% of each qualifying stake is contributed to the jackpot pool. If a jackpot is removed or replaced, any remaining funds will be redistributed to another game or paid out fairly, in line with UK Gambling Commission rules.
